Contract specifications

6. **Description of the contract:**
Supply, install and test of photovoltaic equipment and systems, for the electrification of 25 health units and 18 basic power energetic centres, in the provinces of Zambezia, Tete and Sofala. The contract includes, in addition, the corresponding guarantees on materials and installation, the provision of spare parts, and the local training of the staff for its use and for maintenance tasks.
7. **Number and titles of lots:**
1 lot tender.

Terms of participation

8. **Eligibility and rules of origin:**
Participation in tendering is open on equal terms to natural and legal persons (participating either individually or in a grouping (consortium) of tenderers from ACP States and Member States of the European Union and international organisations as authorised by the instrument applicable to the programme under which the contract is financed (see also item 22 below). All goods supplies under this contract must originate in these countries.
9. **Grounds for exclusion:**
Tenderers must submit a statement to the effect that they are not in any of the situations listed in point 2.3.3 of the 'Practical Guide to contract procedures for EU external actions'.
10. **Number of tenders:**
Tenderers may submit only 1 tender per lot. Tenders for parts of a lot will not be considered. Any tenderer may state in its tender that it would offer a discount in the event that its tender is accepted for more than 1 lot.

Tenderers may not submit a tender for a variant solution in addition to their tender for the supplies required in the tender dossier.

11. **Tender guarantee:**

Tenderers must provide a tender guarantee of 5 000 EUR for the contract when submitting their tender. This guarantee will be released to unsuccessful tenderers once the tender procedure has been completed and to the successful tenderer(s) upon signature of the contract by all parties. This guarantee will be called upon if the tenderer does not fulfil all obligations stated in its tender.

12. **Performance guarantee:**

The successful tenderer will be asked to provide a performance guarantee of 5 % the amount of the contract at the signing of the contract. This guarantee must be provided no later than 30 days after the tenderer receives the contract signed by the contracting authority. If the selected tenderer fails to provide such a guarantee within this period, the contract will be void and a new contract may be drawn up and sent to the tenderer which has submitted the next best compliant tender.

13. **Information meeting and/or site visit:**

No information meeting or site visit is planned.

14. **Tender validity:**

Tenders must remain valid for a period of 90 days after the deadline for submission of tenders.

15. **Period of performance:**

From contract signature until the provisional acceptance the period of performance will be 9 months.

Selection and award criteria

16. **Selection criteria:**

The following selection criteria will be applied to tenderers. In the case of tenders submitted by a consortium, these selection criteria will be applied to the consortium as a whole:

1) Economic and financial capacity of tenderer (based on i.e. item 3 of the tender form for a supply contract):

(a) the average annual turnover of the tenderer must be at least 700 000 EUR.

2) Professional capacity of tenderer (based on i.e. items 4 and 5 of the tender form for a supply contract):

(a) the tenderer has at least 10 staff employed.

3) Technical capacity of tenderer (based on i.e. items 5 and 6 of the tender form for a supply contract):

(a) the tenderer has successfully completed at least 3 contracts with a budget of at least that of this contract in the past 3 years (prior to the submission deadline);

(b) the tenderer has worked successfully on at least 3 projects in fields related to this contract in the past 3 years (prior to the submission deadline) (with installation component).

An economic operator may, where appropriate and for a particular contract, rely on the capacities of other entities, regardless of the legal nature of the links which it has with them. It must in that case prove to the contracting authority that it will have at its disposal the resources necessary for performance of the contract, for example by producing an undertaking on the part of those entities to place those resources at its disposal. Such entities must respect the same rules of eligibility and notably that of nationality, as the economic operator.

17. **Award criteria:**

The award criterion is the price.
